## **School Defibrillator**

As you will be aware, the school was asked to establish and run a COVID testing centre in school from January until March. The DfE has provided schools with additional funding to pay for the staff they anticipated were required to run the testing centre. As a school we took a decision that the most efficient and appropriate way for us to run our testing centre was for the Senior Leadership team of the school to run and administer this and therefore we did not have any additional costs as a result of setting this up. Now that the funding has arrived in school we have looked to invest this in areas that will benefit the school community. We decided that we would use this funding to purchase a defibrillator for the school. Whilst we hope that we will never have cause to use this, we know that for every minute after someone suffers a cardiac arrest, they lose 10% of their survival chances. Having an accessible defibrillator on school site is an important step we can take to try to ensure that if the worst were to happen, we would do all within our power to get the right help to whoever needs it. The defibrillator is stored on a hook outside reception.
