#### Science News - Journal of Science

The latest edition of the Journal of Science is a unique collaboration with the school's Art Department and is subtitled "THE ART OF SCIENCE". The idea arose from a conversation with Mrs Chacksfield, Head of Art, back in January and was designed to showcase a project that Year 12 and Year 10 students had been tasked with: Golden Lockdown. The project was the brainchild of trainee teacher Miss Ruth MacDougall, inspired by the "Voyager Golden Record". Students were invited to produce work that reflected their time during lockdown, with the "Golden Record" in mind. This work has since been published on a dedicated website: http://

The student's introduced their work with their own words as follows: "In January 2021 we returned to Lockdown and the indefinite prospect of working from home. To fully contemplate the hurdles and opportunities that this isolation from our teachers and friends imposed, we were challenged to step outside our comfort zones, look skyward and consider life on earth as we knew it and as we know it now."

As to present each student's work in full would merely duplicate what is already available on their website, Miss Macdougall decided to give students the further opportunity to use the written Journal as a means of enhancement, creating a statement by giving an overview of their work as well as selecting key images. It would therefore add a new dimension to their work.

But what exactly is the "Voyager Golden Record"? In 1977 renowned cosmologist and writer, Professor Carl Sagan, led a team tasked to create a Golden Record of life on Earth, containing greetings, music, sound recordings and images. Their Golden Record, actually a gold-plated copper disc, was fixed to the side of the Voyager spacecraft and launched into space in the hope of introducing us to any inquisitive extra-terrestrials who may find it. The Voyager mission was to fly by and explore the giant planets of Jupiter, Saturn. Uranus and Neptune. The velocity and trajectory of the craft would then take it beyond the Solar System and into interstellar space where it might eventually enter another star system and be picked up by the residents there. By deciphering the messages on the Golden Record they would therefore realise that they are not alone in the Universe.
