On the evening of Tuesday January 25th, our year 12 debate team opposed the motion proposed by the team from Norwich High School that "This House would ban gambling". Despite some technical difficulties, the debating skills of Nokutenda Jaji, Nancy King and Bethinn Feely ensured their progress into the regional finals, the draw for which will take place next week, with the competition being staged between 21st February and 3rd March.

We are hoping that the teams will be able to debate in person, rather than remotely, as this is not only more straightforward logistically, but also supports and promotes the contest as an opportunity to meet, network and broaden all the participants' appreciation of the process and of one another. Since we have drawn opposition roles in both the previous rounds, proposing the motion we are allotted would also enrich the experience of our students. There is, perhaps, a stronger sense of anticipation than in past competitions simply because we have been denied the chance to take part in debates and public speaking for the past two years: the team and I are keen to learn the details of our next debate.

All three are also loyal members and supporters of St Benedict's debate club, co-managed by Mr Hempel (English department), which meets on a weekly basis to thrash out a wide spectrum of issues across all year groups. This has been a great success and those who attend have a hand in its evolution and methods as we make debating as spontaneous and dynamic as possible, continually welcoming new members and watching their confidence grow.
