Inter House Cross Country Championships

The new house system got off to a flying start with an Inter House Cross Country Championship on Thursday 22nd October.

The first to race were the Year 7 boys and girls. Unfortunately, a few Year 7 boys ended up running slightly longer than the 2,400m they should have, but the positions were cleared up in an additional race a week later. Noah Wilkinson (Monte Cassino) was a clear winner in both races and second and third positions (in the extra race) were filled by strong runs from Oliver Lamas Nakagawa (Nursia) and Aiden Cameron (Monte Cassino). The sixteen Year 7 boys who were invited to race again showed excellent resilience. Monte Cassino won a tightly contested team race with 52 points, followed by Subiaco in second with 57 and Nursia in third with 64.

In the Year 7 girls race, Lucy Murphy 7P (Monte Cassino) was in the lead but also ended up running further than she should have done. In the end it was her team-mates Alanna Evans, Amelia Smith and Eliza Rowley who ended up filling the first three places. Miss Dalby was delighted that the first six runners were from 7P and is currently in negotiations with UK Athletics about a potential team manager role! This left Monte Cassino clear winners in the team competition with 26 points, followed by Subiaco in second with 108 and Nursia in third with 120.

Next to race were the Year 8 and 9 boys and girls who completed a 3,200m course. Suffolk County athlete Charlie Oxborrow (Subiaco) dominated the race to finish over a minute ahead in first place, followed by Paddy Matthews (Monte Cassino) in second. Third placed Year 9 boy was Seth Gaw Nursia) in 6th position. This meant that out of the Year 8 boys Archie Coogan (Subiaco) came first in 3rd place overall, followed by Harry Gladstone (Nursia) in 4th and George Wightman (Nursia) in 7th. The team placings were as follows: Year 9 – first Subiaco, second Monte Cassino, third Nursia; Year 8 – first Nursia, second Monte Cassino, third Subiaco.

In the Year 8 and 9 girls race, Eva Torfinn (Nursia) strode to victory in 13.42, which meant that she won the Year 9 race followed by her team-mates Emma Payne in second place and Ciara Evans in 4th place overall (third Year 9). Molly Murphy (Monte Cassino) finished in third place overall to win the Year 8 race, with Eleanor Slater (Monte Cassino) in second and Linduli Jayaneth (Subiaco) in third. The team placings were as follows: Year 9 – first Nursia, second Monte Cassino and third Subiaco; Year 8 – first Subiaco, second Nursia and third Monte Cassino.

The last race of the day was the Year 10 and 11 boys and girls race. In the Year 11 boys race Harry Fasey (Subiaco) was first to cross the line, ahead of Rafael Martinez (Subiaco) in third position overall and Elijah Haye (Nursia) in fifth position overall. In the Year 10 race Kuba Kluczynski (Subiaco) finished first and pushed Harry Fasey all the way to the line to finish second overall, and was followed by Giles Attfield (Subiaco) in 4th position overall and Filip Niedzwieecki in 9th position overall. The team placings were as follows: Year 11 – first Subiaco, second Nursia, third Monte Cassino; Year 10 – first Subiaco, second Monte Cassino, third Nursia.

In the Year 10 and 11 girls race, Phoebe Harpur-Davies (Nursia) ran superbly to finish in first position and won the Year 11 race; and Nancy Bailey finished in second to win the Year 10 race, followed by Caira Pourithodiyilin second and Charlotte Russell in third.

It was wonderful to see the students taking such pride in their newly formed houses and to push themselves as hard as they could for both their individual and team performances. The level of competition was extremely high and bodes well for the athletes who will go on to represent the school team in the Suffolk Schools Cross Country Championships at the Royal Hospital School on the 13th October. We wish them well! We would also like to thank all the teachers and sixth form helpers who acted a timekeepers, recorders and marshals, without whom the event would have been impossible to run.
