St Benedict's held their whole school Number Day on 11th January. Lessons across the school included a numeracy starter and numeracy activities linked to the subject throughout the day. Some examples of this were country populations in French, Spanish and Geography, addition of monarch's Roman Numerals in History, working out the sum of points required to win sports in PE, and finding out the number of Popes there have been in RE.





Rubik's cube club was very popular at lunchtime. We have introduced a variety of speed cubes to our students to try out in our club to improve team work and problem solving. The Cubers meet every Tuesday lunchtime in E2 and are keen to help students to learn the skills of solving the cubes. All students are welcome.

There was a numeracy starter in every lesson across the school during the day. In periods 1-4 the answers to the starter were the numbers 1, 1, 2, 3. In period 5, the students had to guess the relevance of the numbers. The numbers were the start of the Fibonacci sequence. This is a significant sequence as the numbers from it appear in nature and in God's creation. The next number in the sequence is found by adding the two previous numbers together. For example, 1 + 1 = 2, 1 + 2 = 3, 2 + 3 = 5. How far can you continue the sequence?

It was great to see the buzz about numbers throughout the school and we look forward to the next Number Day in 2024.
