Babraham Institute Visit

The Babraham Institute runs an annual schools' day to give students interested in a career in science the opportunity to try some science in research laboratories. The Babraham Institute is located on the East side of Cambridge and is set in beautiful grounds around the original Babraham Hall. The Institute was created in 1948 as a national centre to study livestock farming and breeding, with the aim of using science to help increase production. Over time the aims of the Institute have changed, and it is now one of six National Centres for Research, specialising in Life Sciences, particularly the science of ageing.

Five Y10 students – Kairo Boyaram, Tanasa Nyamande, Bailey Cameron, Mohamad Ismail and Portia Ratcliffe - were selected to attend the day and we met in reception at 11.30 ready to make the journey in the minibus. On arrival we were welcomed to The Institute and given a briefing about how the afternoon would run. The students were then separated into 20 groups of 4/5 and set off to take part in their practical sessions. The practical's lasted about two hours and our students found them very interesting. After the practical sessions we were given a talk by a 3rd year PhD student and the students were given the opportunity to ask questions at the end. The St Benedict's students asked some great questions and were more engaged than many of the sixth form students there.

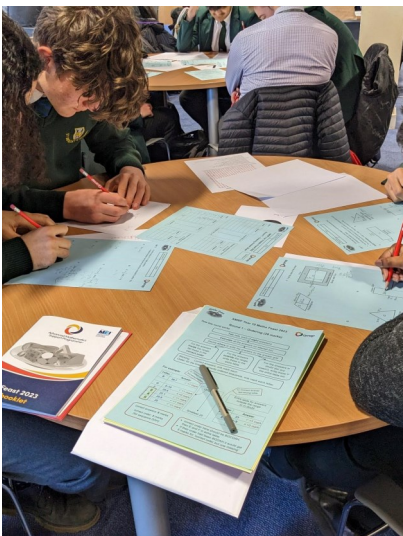
Maths Feast Success

This year we took two teams of our year 10 Maths students to Kesgrave school to compete against other schools from Suffolk, this year the challenge and increased in size and in difficulty, but both of our teams performed brilliantly, achieving awards for their success. The competition never announces an overall winner, but certificates are awarded for winning rounds, scores, consistency and teamwork. The rounds included calculation and ordering, deciphering errors, mathematical comprehension and a closely timed relay race. Our maths superstars put in an excellent performance and both teams were also awarded certificates; one for the highest score at the midway point and the other for having consistently high scores for all four rounds.
