We will be coming back for 'Moore'!

A wonderful day out at Perry Green, Henry Moore's studio and gardens, with our new year 12 Art and Art History A-Level students.

Students explored Moore's three major themes:

The reclining figure

Mother and child

Interior and exterior shapes



Moore's drawings and sculptures play with abstract and figurative representation, often without titles to invite a more personal interaction and analysis with the piece. Students could interact physically with the sculptures and feel the textures of the often cast-bronze figures, with the guidance of the wonderful tour guides from the Henry Moore Foundation.

A tour of Hoglands House, where Moore lived and worked for over 40 years gave students an



even more in depth insight into the history and context of his life as an internationally renowned sculptor.

Students had the opportunity to make their own mini-interpretations of Moore's work using Lego™ and plasticine: grasping at the processes Moore went through to design and create his works. Moore produced over 60 years of work up until his death in 1986 and set up the Henry Moore Foundation to encourage young people to engage with visual arts. He would work from small to large, creating maquettes based on flints and natural forms he often found in the landscape.

Moore's work often went hand in hand with the landscapes they were placed in, adding to his authenticity: for the students to be able to engage with the work in its natural setting was extremely valuable. A visit to Perry Green is highly recommended!

Thank you to all who made the day possible, we will most certainly be keen to come back again next year.
