Exam Certificates

We still have a number of uncollected GCSE and A level certificates belonging to students who sat exams in 2022 and 2023. This will put them in an strong position to excel in their Geographical Investigations paper in the summer exams.

Next stop is a visit to the River Lark to put on some waders, and investigate changing river characteristics.

Why do the French eat pancakes during la Chandeleur?

To better understand this tradition, we need to go back to the 5th Century and the presentation of Jesus in the temple was celebrated exactly 40 days after Christmas on 2nd February. The Pope Galacius I organised candlelight processions to mark this religious event. He also offered pancakes to pilgrims in Rome during this procession.

There were also references to Pagan festivals. The colour and shape of the pancakes represented the sun and warmth which will hopefully return, and the fertility of the earth. Traditionally, these pancakes were eaten with a gold coin in your left hand in order to encourage prosperity.
