 Gothic Writing: focuses on narrative writing skills. A Christmas Carol: a GCSE English Literature text. Assessment & Homework

Students have two formal assessments per year, which cover the content that has been taught up to that point. Students will also regularly practise in class the skills necessary to improve in English.

Students are expected to read regularly as well as prepare for spelling and comprehension tests of Tier 2 Vocabulary. In addition, students will be given regular activities to complete at home to support the study of a particular text or to practise a skill.

Resources

It is recommended that students make use of the school library which is open before and after school and during break and lunchtimes. In addition, students can access the resources for their lessons and knowledge organisers on their class notebook in OneNote. There are also reading lists for each term, which provide ideas for how students can expand their appreciation of the texts that are being studied in class.
