### **Assessment & Homework**

Students have two formal assessments per year, which cover the content that has been taught up to that point. The second of these assessments will be mock GCSE exams in the Summer term. Students will also regularly practise in class the skills necessary to improve in English.

Students will be given a combination of short activities and longer-term projects to complete at home to support the study of a particular text or to practise a skill.

### Resources

It is recommended that students make use of the school library which is open before and after school and during break and lunchtimes. In addition, students can access the resources for their lessons and knowledge organisers on their class notebook in OneNote. There are also reading lists for each term, which provide ideas for how students can expand their appreciation of the texts that are being studied in class.
